## INTRODUCTION

The KJC annual report provides a description of the mandate, organisation structure, role and responsibilities of this institution, performed activities in 2015 and KJC challenges. In the first chapter the reader can be familiar with the KJC organization and activity. The annual report is focused, in particular, in description of activities undertaken by the KJC, adopted act, memos, CMIS Project, etc.

Another chapter of the report describes the KJC Secretariat structure and activities, followed by the chapter on the activities of the courts. A special part of this report is the KJC cooperation with other Kosovo and international institutions.

The report continues with IT activities as a special part of judicial system. Also, an important place in this report has the Court performance review unit.

The last chapter presents the court statistics report for 2016.

Therefore, the significance of this report lies on the fact that the work, responsibility, achievements and challenges are the public overview to informing the citizens about all activities with the aim of serious reflection of judicial system in Kosovo.



# CHAPTER I

## KJC ORGANISATION AND ACTIVITY

### KJC ROLE AND POWERS

The KJC powers are defined in the Constitution and the Law on Kosovo Judicial Council on the basis of which the KJC has a fundamental role in ensuring independence and impartiality of judicial system. The KJC has been established by the Constitution of Republic of Kosovo as a governing body of the judiciary. The Kosovo Judicial Council is completely independent in exercising its functions. The KJC is responsible for judges' recruitment and in recommending them for appointment, judicial inspection, judicial administration and budget management and determining the rules for an appropriate functioning of the courts. Also, the Council is responsible for transfer and disciplinary proceedings against judges.

KJC, in its composition, is expected to have thirteen (13) members, such as: eight (8) members are to be selected by the Assembly of Republic of Kosovo, whereas five (5) members are to be selected from among the judges themselves. The mandate of the Council members is five (5) years.

## KJC ACTIVITIES

In 2016 the KJC has held 25 meetings and taken 162 decisions, adopted 19 regulations and 5 administrative instructions as well.

During this period the Council has appointed the KJC Chair, Basic court presidents in Prishtina, Ferizaj, Pejë, Prizren, Gjakovë and organized the appointment ceremony of two (2) Kosovo Judicial Council members from among the judges.

In July 2016, Kosovo Judicial Council organized the selection of two (2) new members of KJC from among the judges, who will substitute their two colleagues with expired mandate in this duty.

Nominated as candidate for the Council members were eleven (11) judges, and were selected: Anita Prenaj Krasniqi, judge in Basic court in Prishtina and Skender Çoçaj, judge in Basic court in Prizren. Their mandate is five years.

Meanwhile, in February 2016, it was held the Kosovo Judicial Council meeting with an agenda on selection of Kosovo Judicial Council (KJC) Chair. Based on procedural obligations, the following members had presented their candidacy for KJC Chair, and they were:

- Makifete Saliuka, judge in the Court of Appeals of Kosovo, and
- Nehat Idrizi, judge in the Court of Appeals of Kosovo.

After the voting procedure organized in transparent manner, the KJC members, with majority of votes, selected the new KJC Chair Mr. Nehat Idrizi, judge in the Court of Appeal. Mandate of the new KJC Chair started from 9<sup>th</sup> of March 2019 and it is for three (3) years.

### **Recruitment process of judges**

Kosovo Judicial Council, in accordance with article 108 of the Constitution of Republic of Kosovo, under the Law no. 03/L-199 (amended) on Courts, Law no. 03/L-223 (amended) on Kosovo Judicial Council and Regulation no. 05/2016 on recruitment, examination, appointment and reappointment of judges, advertised an announcement with opening deadline from 25 April 2016 to 25 May 2016.

For sixty one (61) open positions, two hundred seventy two (272) candidates applied.

After performed assessment and verification, it was concluded that fifty six (56) candidates failed to meet the conditions provided in the announcement, while two candidates withdrew during the process during the various stages. Based on the legal infrastructure, OJAV informed all candidates who were not recommended by the Appointment committee.

Regulation no. 05/2016 on recruitment, examination, appointment and reappointment of judges, article 10 paragraph 3, all candidates who were not recommended by the Appointment committee for different reasons, were enabled to submit a request for review.

After receiving written complaints within the legal deadline, Reconsideration Committee reviewed seventeen (17) requests for review and decided to approve two (2) requests, whereas fifteen (15) of them refused.

### **Internal announcement**

Kosovo Judicial Council, in accordance with article 108 of the Constitution of Republic of Kosovo, under the Law no. 03/L-199 (amended) on Courts, Law no. 03/L-223 (amended) on Kosovo Judicial Council and Regulation no. 05/2016 on promotion procedure of judges (amended), has advertised an internal announcement for judges. For Supreme Court there were two (2) vacancies, while for the Court of Appeals were four (4) vacancies.

Two vacancies for Supreme Court of Kosovo. Seventeen (17) candidate – judges have applied for these free vacancies. Two candidates (2) withdrew during different stages. One (1) candidate did not meet required formal conditions.

Four (4) vacancies for the Court of Appeals. Twenty two (22) candidates – judges have applied for these positions. One (1) candidate did not meet required formal conditions.

## **Selection process of Court Presidents**

In November 2016, Kosovo Judicial Council announced a competition for Basic courts presidents and supervising judges of branches. During the legal deadline, forty five (45) judges have applied for these positions. Six (6) candidates applied for Basic court in Pristina, two (2) candidates applied for Basic court in Ferizaj, four (4) candidates applied for Basic court in Peja, but one (1) candidate for B. C. in Gjakova and B. C. in Prizren.

On 20 Dec 2016, Kosovo Judicial Council took a decision that the following person be appointed as court president, such as:

- Afërdita Bytyqi – President of the Basic Court in Prishtina,
- Kreshnik Radoniqi - President of the Basic Court in Peja,
- Ymer Hoxha - President of the Basic Court in Prizren,
- Bashkim Hyseni - President of the Basic Court in Ferizaj and
- Vaton Durguti - President of the Basic Court in Gjakova.

## KOSOVO JUDICIAL COUNCIL COMMITTEES

The KJC Committees have been established to support the exercise of its mandate. Each committee has at least three (3) members, who are elected by the KJC for a mandate of two (2) years. The Committees support the KJC in accordance with its respective mandate.

The Kosovo Judicial Council, under article 9 of the Law on Kosovo Judicial Council, has established the following permanent committees:

- Committee for Normative Issues,
- Committee for Budget, Finance and Personnel,
- Court Administrative Committee,
- Disciplinary Committee,
- Committee for Evaluation of Judges' Performance, and
- Committee for Compensation of Damage for Convicted or Arrested Persons without reason.

## COMMITTEE ON NORMATIVE ISSUES

The Committee on Normative Issues of Kosovo Judicial Council is composed by three (3) members and one (1) stand-by member. This committee, during this period, recommended the Council for approval of the following secondary legislation, such as:

- Regulation on determining the misconduct;
- Regulation on amending the regulation on recruitment, examination, appointment and reappointment of judges;
- Regulation on recruitment, exam, appointment and reappointment of judges;
- Regulation on amending and supplementing the regulation on recruitment, examination, appointment and reappointment of judges;
- Regulation on Selection Procedure, Appointment, Evaluation, Suspension and Dismissal of s President Judges and Supervising Judges;

- Regulation on Amending and Supplementing the Regulation on Selection Procedure, Appointment, Evaluation, Suspension and Dismissal of President Judges and Supervising Judges;
- Regulation on Amending the Regulation on the Role and Activity of the Steering Board of ICT/CMIS project;
- Code of Professional Ethics for Judge;
- Regulation on Evaluation of Judges' Performance;
- Regulation on Recruitment, Exam, Appointment and Reappointment of Judges;

## **COMMITTEE FOR BUDGET, FINANCE AND PERSONNEL**

The Committee for Budget, Finance and Personnel is composed by three (3) members. During the year 2016, it has held a workshop with the agenda of listening to budget requirements for 2017 for the courts of Republic of Kosovo.

## COURTS ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE

The Court Administration Committee, in the course of its work, has managed to meet its duties and responsibilities successfully and timely.

During this period, the Committee held eight (8) meetings and handled, with professionalism and particular attention, the need of unification administrative practice in all courts of Kosovo.

Within its competences, the Committee for Court Administration has issued:

- One (1) proposal for issuing the decision for approval of composition of unique forms for summing the parties at trial in Supreme Court, the Court of Appeal and Basic court in all proceedings (criminal, civil, executive, commercial, administrative, etc.). which is submitted to the Council for approval;
- One (1) draft administrative Instruction for unification of court fees;
- One (1) draft warning for fees payment and
- One (1) draft notification for the right from exemption of court fees payment which will be submitted very soon to the Council for approval.

## DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

On 2016, the Disciplinary Committee of KJC has received all together thirteen (13) final reports and two (2) recommendations for suspension from the Office of Disciplinary Prosecutor.

The Committee has held thirteen (13) regular hearings and one (1) extraordinary, in which has already reviewed thirteen (13) final reports in total and one (1) recommendation for suspension.

In reviewing these reports, in the hearings mentioned above, have been taken all together fourteen (14) decisions and have been imposed the following measures:

- Reprimand - one (1) decision;
- Release from responsibility – five (5) decisions;



- Temporary suspension until criminal proceedings against him is ended - one (1) decision;
- It is proposed to the Kosovo Judicial Council to recommend the President of Republic of Kosovo a removal (dismissal) from the office – two (2) decisions;
- The disciplinary proceedings has been ceased – four (4) decisions;
- The recommendation of the Office of the Disciplinary Prosecutor (ODC) was postponed for judge's suspension by obliging the ODC to complete its final report within 30 days period from the decision making day - one (1) decision.

## COMMITTEE FOR EVALUATION OF JUDGES' PERFORMANCE

The Committee on Evaluation of Judges' Performance is one of the KJC standing committees, based on article 9, paragraph 1.5 of the law no.03/L-223 on Kosovo Judicial Council (amended and supplemented by Law no.05/L-033).

The composition of this committee is regulated by article 19/A of the Law on KJC and in article 20 of the Regulation 11/2016 on evaluation of judges performance, under which the committee is composed by thirteen (13) member-judges, including the President of the Committee, who is appointed from among the judges of the Supreme Court and simultaneously should be member of KJC.

The Committee, within its composition, represents different instance of judicial system, so that, the Supreme Court appoints five (5) judges, the Court of Appeals appoints four (4) judges and Basic courts, from among the judges, appoints three (3) judges.

The Committee does the evaluation of the performance of the Kosovo judges, in full accordance with the evaluation criteria set forth in the Regulation on Evaluation of Judges' Performance of and its evaluation is the basis for promotion or demotion on duty as well as discharge from judge's duty.

## **COMMITTEE FOR COMPENSATION OF DAMAGE FOR PERSONS CONVICTED OR ARRESTED WITHOUT REASON**

The Committee for compensation of damage for persons convicted or arrested without reason consists of three (3) members. One (1) president, two (2) regular members and two (2) reserve. In 2016, the Committee has reviewed one hundred (100) applications for compensation of damage. The total amount already paid in 2016 for this category was three hundred sixty eight thousand and one hundred twenty one €368,121.00.

## CONDITIONAL RELEASE PANEL

The decision for Conditional release is taken by an independent body. The Conditional release panel is established by Kosovo Judicial Council (KJC) in compliance with law.

This panel consists of three (3) members; one (1) judge from Supreme Court of Kosovo, one (1) prosecutor from the Office of the Chief State Prosecutor and one (1) Kosovo Police representative. Due to a delicate nature of the conditional release decision of any convicted person, this panel is chaired by a judge of Kosovo Supreme Court. Also, KJC appoints one (1) representative delegated by Rectorate / law faculty, as fourth member, with knowledge and experience from respective professional field, who is selected to be on standby for decision taking in cases when the law foresees exemption of one panel member in a certain case, or replacement in the lack of another member.

From 1<sup>st</sup> January 2016 till 31 December 2016, the panel held thirty nine 39 sessions. Four hundred forty five (445) convicted persons have applied. Four hundred twenty seven applications for conditional release reviewed, while eighteen (18) cases were transferred for review in 2017. Out of four hundred twenty seven reviewed cases, one hundred (138) were approved; two hundred fifty (250) were refused with possibility of reviewing them again, by the time specified in the law.

The procedures ended for twenty six (26) cases, for six (6) cases the review was postponed for thirty (30) days; the procedure was suspended for eight (8) cases, whereas two (2) cases were refused as unacceptable.

It is worth mentioning that the treatment of cases was monitored by EULEX judges assigned to monitor the Conditional release panel hearings. Also, for each session was invited the Ombudsman to monitor the review of cases.

In 2016, Kosovo Probation Service supervised two hundred thirty (230) convicts conditionally released by the Panel. Out of them, twenty three (23) cases successfully completed the supervision, while two hundred seventeen (217) cases are still under supervision and control of Kosovo probation service, respectively by the Regional directorate.

During this period the Probation service has reported two (2) cases due to violation of the conditions by those who were released conditionally and proposed the revocation of conditional release.

## CHAPTER II

### STRATEGIC PLAN 2014 – 2019

Strategic plan of Kosovo Judiciary adopted in April 2014 that includes the period 2014-2019 has as key goal to serve as an orienting tool of Kosovo Judicial Council regarding the aims and objectives to be achieved in the period 2014-2019. This plan is divided in five (5) key pillars, where in each pillar there are objectives and detailed plans of action for realising the respective objectives.

To date, KJC has realised more than half of objectives as foreseen in the plan. However, taking into consideration that some of the goals have constant character, it has to be done systematically in their realisation.

Strategic plan pillars are:

- Building trust and support;
- Advancing the administration of justice;
- Increase of access to justice and services for citizens;
- Promotion of competence, professionalism and behaviour, and
- Improvement of facilities and technology of courts

The goal of this part of the annual report 2014 is to present the KJC achievements towards meeting the objectives over the last year.

## **PILLAR I – BUILDING TRUST AND SUPPORT**

The main achievement in line with the first goal is the amendment of the Constitution of Republic of Kosovo with regard to the composition of KJC members. Kosovo Judicial Council insisted on the importance of a bigger KJC composition from among the judges, which is in full compliance with international standards and opinion of Consultative Council of European Judges. Now, out of thirteen (13) members, seven are selected from among the judges, the rest six (6) of them are selected from the Assembly.

In compliance with this, KJC has amended also the Regulation on selection of member from among the judges. Through this Regulation it has been ensured the gender equality from among the judges. Changing the status of court administration staff is another important objective of first pillar of Strategic plan. The law on amending and supplementing the Law on Courts, in its transitional provisions, foresees to have a special law issuance which will regulate the status of court administrative staff. It is expected that this concept to be sent to the Government, requiring the initiation of procedure to having a special law issuance on court administration based on the principles of the Law on Civil Servants.

## **PILLAR II – PROMOTION OF JUSTICE ADMINISTRATION**

In this reporting year, KJC, based on statistics for judges 'number, has published a vacancy announcement for recruitment of sixteen one (61) new judges throughout the country. The recruitment process is expected to end this year, while the same will start the work on courts after having completed the one (1) year training period. Also, KJC has published an internal vacancy announcement for judges' promotion in the Court of Appeal and Supreme Court for which the procedure is going to end this year.

With purpose of better management of human resources, KJC transferred some judges to the courts where the work volume was bigger.

As result, KJC should prepare a Strategic plan for human resource management with purpose of professionalising the court's staff.

### **Adoption of bylaws and necessary policies for an efficient judicial system**

KJC, in the reporting year, has drawn considerable number of bylaws, which are mainly derived from amendments in the legal framework. As the most important bylaws worth to mention:

Regulation on recruitment, examination, appointment and reappointment of judges. Regulation on selection procedure, appointment, evaluation, suspension and dismissal of presidents judge and supervising judges, Regulation on evaluation of judges' performance. Although, a small number of bylaws, foreseen to be prepared on the basis of applicable laws, remain to be adopted in a near future, a considerable number of bylaws was prepared and adopted by Kosovo Judicial Council on time.

Adoption of all bylaws was preceded by a wide consultation with all relevant actors and external donors that assist the KJC. Only after reflection to the proposals of all actors was proceeded with their consent.

### **Building the management mechanisms for judicial accountability**

Within this goal, two strategic objectives have been envisaged to be realised as the main:

- (i) the elimination of backlog and adoption of procedures to avoid the future backlog, and
- (ii) the establishment and implementation of procedures and mechanisms to promote individual accountability throughout the judicial system.

It is expected to have positive impact on the realisation of the objective in eliminating the backlog right now when the new Law on Minor Offences is already enacted, where the number of Minor Offences cases will decrease, and thus a part of judges of this field shall judge cases from other fields. Increase of number of judges, which will take place this year, is also expected to have a positive impact in reducing the backlog. National Strategy of Backlog Reduction is no longer in force.

In close cooperation with USAID and UNDP program, Kosovo Judicial Council works towards the development of action plan for all Basic courts and the Court of Appeals, towards the elimination of backlog in the courts, whether through improvement of existing technical gaps either through engagement of professional associates.

## **Handover of responsibilities of administration and personnel from Secretariat to the courts**

KJC has fully completed the planned objectives within this goal. From January 1, 2016, all responsibilities have been delegated to the courts in personnel, finance, procurement and logistics issues.

In the reporting period the staff recruitment already has taken place in the courts in order to cope with extended powers, as well as training of court personnel in personnel, finance, procurement and logistics issues.



## **PILLAR III – INCREASE OF ACCESS TO JUSTICE AND SERVICE FOR CITIZENS**

### **The Judiciary will encourage minority communities to be part of judicial system**

The KJC is in the final stage of achieving the objectives set out in this goal. As it is foreseen in the Brussels agreement for Justice, KJC has published a vacancy announcement for recruitment of forty eight (48) judges from non-majority communities. Also the KJC has already completed the procedures for recruitment of hundred fifty (115) persons from non-majority communities as supporting staff in the courts of all level.

### **Kosovo Judiciary shall ensure the public has access to documents and courts data which are reliable and provided on time**

In this reporting period it has been launched the new judicial portal from which can be taken rapid information on the KJC activities and courts throughout Kosovo and legal acts issued by KJC. The launching of the new portal meets one of strategic objectives of this goal. What remains to be realised in the coming years, so that this purpose is fully fulfilled, is that as soon as possible to have published the final judgements continuously, since, the number of published final judgement is so small currently, due to technical problems and lack of human resources. With CMIS functionality, technical issues will be resolved and also enable the electronic monitoring of cases and thus facilitating its publication online.

### **The judiciary aims to increase public confidence and support in the courts through public communication**

Courts at all levels have public information officers excluding B.C. in Mitrovica and B.C. in Gjakova) and all courts activities are published in the judicial portal and local media.

KJC has already adopted the Communication Strategy, where the key role of public information is of the KJC communication coordination office in cooperation with the courts public information officers.

## **PILLAR IV – PROMOTION OF COMPETENCE, PROFESSIONALISM AND CONDUCT**

Within the Pillar IV of Strategic Plan is planned only one goal: increased judges' promotion and training and supporting staff. In fact, the promotion of justice system through the increased professionalism is a constant target of KJC. And not only for the period of five (5) years covered by this strategic plan.

In the reporting period KJC has drafted the Regulation on evaluation of judge's performance and the Regulation on selection procedure, appointment, evaluation, suspension and dismissal of president judges and supervising judges. These regulations are a guarantee the Court personnel is subject to evaluation of their performance periodically, while the evaluation criteria are objective and measurable.

Another objective of this pillar is also to encourage non-judicial procedures to reduce the workload of the courts. KJC has approved the plan this year with regard to the establishment of Alternative Disputes Resolution in Kosovo Justice system. Initially, this plan will be valid for Basic Court in Pristina with its branches, and later is planned to be extended to all courts. Under this plan the mediators will be placed in a suitable office in the court building, and with the consent of parties under proceedings, they could be assigned suitable cases for mediation.

Within the project of Case Management Information System (CMIS) for the administrative staff and judges were held trainings in IT field. This year were trained the officers who did not show satisfactory result in the use of technology in the initial test, which was held in 2014.

## **PILLAR V – IMPROVEMENT OF COURT PREMISES AND TECHNOLOGY**

Given the need for the improvement of court facilities, after having Basic Court of Prishtina, the Court of Appeals and supreme court placed in Justice Palace, KJC is at the end of the new Basic Court building in Ferizaj also have started construction works of Basic Court in Gjakova and Basic Court in Gjilan-branch in Novobërdë.

KJC Secretariat has sent the Instruction on physical security of Justice Palace and Kosovo courts to the Committee for normative Issues.

The goal of this instruction is to establish the rules for the provision of security services in Justice Palace, namely in the buildings A, B and D.

This instruction shall define the roles and responsibilities of the court security officers, receptionists, judges and court personnel.

## INSTITUTIONAL COOPERATION OF KOSOVO JUDICIAL COUNCIL

KJC, during 2016, has signed a total of three (3) Memorandums of Understandings. More precisely these have been signed:

- Memorandum of Understanding between KJC and AAB College – Faculty of Law, whose aim is to establish cooperation between the two institutions, facilitate the holding of practice (participation in court proceedings, organizing various seminars, study tours of students in courts, cooperation for judicial practical simulation) for students of the Law Faculty.
- Memorandum of Understanding between KJC and Kosovo Law Institute (KLI), in order to increase the transparency and accountability of KJC, courts and their branches and court administration and their branches. Supporting projects to improve the justice system and the rule of law in Kosovo as well as monitoring of KJC meetings by KLI, including access to acts and documents, which will be approved by the KJC.
- Memorandum of Understanding between the KJC and the Organization for Democracy, Anticorruption and Dignity – QOHU, as well as the organization for Communication and Social Development – CSD, regarding the monitoring of judicial procedures in order to contribute together to the best interest of the public and judiciary.

## PROJECT ICT/CMIS

In accordance with the Strategic Plan 2012-2017 of KJC for ICT (Information and Communication Technology) adopted by the Kosovo Judicial Council, in March 2012, during 2014 KJC has started implementing the project for managing CMIS. Realization of the project was preceded by a grant given to KJC from the Government of Norway, the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding between the Kosovo Judicial Council (KJC), Kosovo Prosecutorial Council (KPC), Kosovo Ministry of Justice (KMJ) and the Norwegian Embassy.

The overall objective of this project is to create a basis for a more efficient, transparent and accountable judicial in Kosovo through the use of ICT, which includes:

- Transformation of Kosovo courts in e-courts,
- Proactive management of courts based on reports and data in real time and,
- Readiness of on-line services for citizens through the creation of a judicial web portal.

The project for easier implementation is divided into two phases: preparatory phase which has already been completed in June 2015 and the main phase of the project which started immediately after the end of the preparatory phase and is scheduled for completion in late 2018.

The main activities which will follow during the main project phase are:

- Develop appropriate legal and regulatory framework to put to use the system;
- Development of the software for courts and prosecutors;
- Implementation, training and user training for the system and use of the system in courts and prosecution;
- Preparation of hardware infrastructure, data centre and computer network of courts and prosecution;

- Building human capacity in ICT, KJC and KPC Departments to maintain the system and to provide support for users to use the system.

During 2016, the project worked on implementation of ICT/CMIS Project Work Plan for the period of January-December 2016. During this period, important activities are realized in preparation of appropriate infrastructure.

Activities during the main phase of the project are:

- As part of the CMIS software development, the prototype system was developed which was tested also in September 2016. In the last quarter of 2016 work has been done on developing CMIS for criminal field for the general department. According to the working plan, CMIS for this area will be ready in January 2017 and will continue with further development of CMIS for criminal area of serious crimes and for juvenile.
- Important activities are carried out in preparation of the hardware infrastructure. The new data centre is designed that will be built on the premises of the Palace of Justice. Also, the plan for increasing capacities of computer networks for courts and prosecution is prepared for establishment.
- The plan for training, qualification and implementation of CMIS is prepared and approved and implementation of the plan will begin in February 2017. The plan will initially begin to be implemented in Basic Court in Ferizaj which is a model court for testing the CMIS, before the system starts to expand enforcement in other courts.
- The plan for the establishment of increased capacity of ICT offices in KJC and KPC is also prepared, in order to create the necessary resources to ensure sustainability of the implementation of the system even after the CMIS project funded by the Norwegian Government is over.

## BACKLOG REDUCTION STRATEGY

Implementation of the Backlog Strategy has started to be realized according to the plan, but there are various reasons in terms of delay of this plan, starting from the small number of judges, but there are cases when the courts have already exceeded its work plan in this direction.

With this strategy we have thought to bring benefits to the Kosovo judiciary, and also trustful to the parties and citizens of Kosovo. Therefore, like any strategy, this one also has some shortcomings we have been facing during our work; the reason of non-fulfilment of the strategy is the huge number of cases in the courts and lack of judges.

In the following there is a table showing the number of Basic courts and its branches in Republic of Kosovo.

## **PROCESS OF EUROPEAN INTEGRATION**

2016 was an active year for the Kosovo Judicial Council in terms of the European integration process. During this year, KJC in cooperation with the Ministry of European Integration drafted the National Plan for the implementation of the Stabilization and Association Agreement, which envisaged some KJC activities qualified as key in terms of building more functional judiciary.

Also, KJC has played an important role in the implementation of the activities envisaged by the Strategy for Development, activities that are focused on: reducing the backlog in fiscal division, functioning of CMIS and reducing the backlog in general. The same applies also with the European reforms agenda, within which the KJC must complete the analysis of budgetary needs and those of human resources in relation to reducing the backlog in the Fiscal Division of the Basic Court of Prishtina.

In accordance with the visa liberalization process, KJC has fulfilled all the obligations set forth in the Kosovo judiciary. It has also actively fulfilled the data base created by the Special Prosecutor's Office in conjunction with high-profile cases.

## **FEASIBILITY STUDY, THE STABILIZATION AND ASSOCIATION DIALOGUE AND OTHER MATTERS**

During 2016, KJC has been part of the Joint Board for Rule of Law. The board intends to gather around the table the KJC Chair, EULEX Ambassador, EU Special Representative in Kosovo, the Minister of Justice and KPC Chair with the purpose that all these actors to discuss the important issues for the rule of law in Kosovo and draw common conclusions on how to proceed in order to address potential issues that threaten the rule of law in the country.

During the last meeting, was discussed the issue of reducing the backlog, amendment of Criminal Code and the Code of Criminal Procedure, secondary legislation of KPC and KJC, selection of KJC members of Parliament, other findings from the country report as well as the integration process in the north.



## COOPERATION WITH INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS AND DONORS' SUPPORT

Kosovo Judicial Council, in order to increase the efficiency of the judicial system relies on the help and support of international partners. Assistance towards ensuring an independent and transparent judiciary is provided continuously by: Embassy of the United States, the European Union office in Kosovo, the EULEX mission for the rule of law, USAID programs, United Nations Development Program (UNDP), the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Norwegian Government, the Mission for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) and the Council of Europe.

Regarding to what was said above; in 2016 the EU Twinning Project was initiated to support the Judicial Council and the Kosovo Prosecution Council. This project is aimed at ensuring the efficiency and transparency of the judicial system as a whole, while enabling through best practices and standards achievement of European countries, to influence the membership of the Republic of Kosovo to the European Union.

Furthermore, the program of USAID on strengthening the justice system in Kosovo continues to support the Kosovo Judicial Council in many areas, including strategies for reducing the backlog of cases, drafting of secondary legislation, giving advice and raising capacities within the KJC. From this program, benefits not only Kosovo Judicial Council, but also the courts in general.

In this regard, it cannot be ignored the continuous effort of UNDP, which supports Kosovo Judicial Council to a large extent, by providing assistance through the identification of the judiciary needs and enabling easier communication with other institutions of justice, Kosovo Prosecutorial Council, Kosovo Judicial Institute and the Ministry of Justice. UNDP contributes in this way in terms of coordination of key processes and activities that affect the common themes of interest to all the above institutions.

Kosovo Judicial Council appreciates the importance of cooperation with the EULEX Mission for the Rule of Law and expects any type assistance towards the creation of better policies and its implementation, in accordance with international standards.

## EU OFFICE PROJECT IN KOSOVO IN SUPPORT TO KJC

Twinning project "Strengthening the efficiency, accountability and transparency of the Judicial and Prosecutorial System in Kosovo" is financed by the EU and managed by the European Union Office in Kosovo.

Project implementing partners are as follows:

- The Italian High Council of the Judiciary.
- The Italian Ministry of Justice.
- The French Ministry of Justice.

Beneficiaries of the project are as follows:

- Kosovo Judicial Council (KJC).
- Kosovo Prosecutorial Council (KPC).
- Kosovo Special Prosecution Office (KSPO).

Project duration is thirty (30) months starting from October 2016. The work plan includes two (2) components based on interdependent activities, which will also apply during the two and a half years (30 months).

These two components are as follows:

- Component no.1: Increase of efficiency, accountability and transparency of the Kosovo Judicial and Prosecutorial System;
- Component no. 2: Capacity building of the Special Prosecution Office of Kosovo capacities in (SPOK).

The project implementation is done through various methods, such as counselling through access to the parties of the same level (peer-to-peer);

- Technical support through activities which will strengthen staff capacity to implement their obligations and fulfil their functions;
- Training programs designed upon request (Tailor-made), including designing the thematic curriculum of training materials;
- Joint workshops and roundtables that will establish a mechanism to improve coordination with the relevant stakeholders and exchange of best practices with other regional and European institutions;

- Analysis and recommendations on existing legal framework, assessment and recommended changes to the existing organizational structure of the KJC / KPC / KSPO, as well as the submission of recommendations with proposals for improvement;
- Study and practical visits will be organized for representatives of the beneficiary state institutions for the exchange of best practices;
- Preparing documentation on the existing procedures regarding the internal organization of the KJC / KPC / KSPO, disciplinary procedures and inspections, evaluation and promotion system.

First activities were developed on the above mentioned topics. Starting from December 2016, Italian experts have implemented two evaluation activities.

While, in terms of organization and functioning of the Kosovo Judicial Council, it is expected to be provided the initial recommendations from these activities, which indicate the human resources management, evaluation of performance of judges, issues dealing with disciplinary system and review of regulations or legal provisions.

## ANNUAL JUDICIAL CONFERENCE

Kosovo Judicial Council (KJC), being supported by the OSCE Mission, organized its sixth Annual Judicial Conference on 5<sup>th</sup> December 2016. Present were: the OSCE Ambassador in Kosovo, representatives of Embassies in Kosovo, representatives from the Kosovo Prosecution Office, NGO representatives, Media Representatives and all Judicial Bodies of the Justice System.

In the conference it was discussed on the achievements in Kosovo Judicial System, the current situation in the courts, the challenges of reorganization since 2013 and needs to continue the reform of the judiciary. Also, a discussion topic was also the quality of justice, accountability and transparency as well as the package of laws in the judiciary.

Despite the challenges to the justice system, the year 2016, in this conference, was considered as successful for the courts. " There are also achievements that have been evaluated and accepted by the European Union in 2016 Kosovo Report". And that all remarks as: lack of accountability, lack of electronic case management system, the large number of backlog of cases and prepared recommendations will be treated with diligence and responsibility " - so pledged holders of the justice system of this conference.

Among others, for a better judiciary it was required a greater and more serious commitment of all people within the justice system, but also of the state and society in general.

Also the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE) gave its contribution presenting the report on the review of the Criminal Procedural Code.

Also, the Supreme Court of Kosovo continued the publication of a bulletin and published " The third Bulletin of the Supreme Court".

At the end of the conference, it was recommended to proceed with judicial reforms, to fight harshly against corruption, to work harder to improve the image of the courts and protect the rights of citizens.

## CHAPTER III

### ACTIVITIES OF THE KJC SECRETARIAT

#### ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONNEL

With the Law on Budget for 2016 for the budget line of the Kosovo Judicial Council are allowed a total of: 2159 positions, and that:

For judges are allowed four hundred and fifty-two (452) positions. From these positions, thirteen (13) positions are allowed on the Special Chamber of the Supreme Court and forty-eight (48) positions for the implementation of the Brussels Agreement for Basic Court in Mitrovica.

For administrative staff in the courts, Secretariat and Council units are allowed one thousand seven hundred and seven (1707) positions. From these positions: one hundred and fifteen (115) positions are for the implementation of the Brussels Agreement for the Basic Court in Mitrovica, for the Special Chamber of the Supreme Court twenty-nine (29) positions, for the Office of Disciplinary Counsel (ODC) twenty (20) and for the Review Unit of the Judicial Performance (RUJP) seven (7) positions.

Number of positions compared to last year has increased to forty-three (43) positions, (eighteen (18) positions for judges and twenty-three (23) positions for administrative staff). All these positions have risen for the implementation of the Brussels Agreement for the Basic Court in Mitrovica.

For courts and other units of the Council, the number of positions for judges as administrative staff has remained the same compared to 2015, even though new positions for administrative staff were requested, but not allowed.

From 1<sup>st</sup> of January 2016, the responsibilities were delegated from the Secretariat to the courts in the areas of personnel, budget and finance, procurement and logistics. The Courts are successfully carrying out these responsibilities in spite of some minor difficulties that have arisen.

For the reporting period, there have been recruitments of candidates for vacant positions for civil servants under the Brussels Agreement, but they have not started to work yet.

For the Secretariat were recruited only two (2) positions, for the Office of Disciplinary Counsel were recruited three (3) positions of legal officers and ten (10) positions of interns with one year term that were funded by UNDP.

The reason for not recruiting other positions, which were free and provided with the budget for the Secretariat as well as for the Council units, was due to the lack of funds.

Despite repeated requests to increase the number of judicial trainees, these positions were not allowed by the budget. As there are no positions foreseen in the budget for interns in courts, we cannot be very optimistic that in the future we will have new framework qualified and prepared to transfer the duties of professional associates and later on of the judges. For this reason we were forced to recruit voluntary unpaid interns.

This is one of our concerns that, despite the commitments, we require also an understanding from the Ministry of Finance to incorporate these positions in the system as they were before, in order that better prepared candidates to apply for these positions.

## BUDGET AND FINANCE

According to the Constitution of the Republic of Kosovo, Law on Kosovo Judicial Council and Law on Public Financial Management and Accountability, KJC is responsible for supervising the preparation and implementation of the annual budget for the entire Kosovo judicial system and is responsible for monitoring expenses of allocated funds and accounting functions of financial control, in accordance with the applicable law.

The KJC plans, manages and is assisted by the Secretariat on budget execution, which includes budget for all courts in Kosovo and the Secretariat of the Council, Unit for Judicial Performance Review and the Office of Disciplinary Counsel. As of January 2016, according to the decision No.73/2014 of KJC on delegation of responsibilities and budget programs of these courts: Supreme Court, the Special Chamber, the Court of Appeal, Basic Court in Prishtina, Basic Court in Prizren, Basic Court in Gjiilan Basic Court in Ferizaj, Basic Court in Pejë, Basic Court in Gjakova and Basic Court in Mitrovica manage with their budget.

KJC Secretariat manages also the procedures of generating incomes and deposits from the courts and Special Chamber of the Supreme Court.

The Secretariat receives, prepares and processes payments (receipts) of budget expenses from internal services of the Council as a budget and procurement plan for services, supplies and work done by the Council's contractors, as well Kosovo courts, such as payments for lay judges, lawyers according to official duty, judicial experts, etc.

## BUDGET 2016

The total budget of the Kosovo Judicial Council as budget organization and its programs for 2016, according to the Law no.5/L-071, is €20,465,768, for a total of 2159 positions, out of them 453 judges and 1706 administrative positions.

According to the reviewed budget law no.05/L-109 KJC budget is €20,745,488.00.

With the new budget law, the category of wages and salaries increased for €279,720.00, according to government's decision on increments for the judges for serious crimes.

The final budget of KJC, in SIMFK, for 2016 is €20,234,241.42, which is for €700,000 lower due to budget savings in the category of wages and salaries. (According to the procedures of the MEF if the budget cannot be spent it should be declared as savings).

With the KJC's request and the decision by the Government of Kosovo from the investment code have been e transferred €200,000.00 to the goods and services. The project of supplies with IT equipment in the amount of €200,000.00 has been transferred due to the budgetary difficulties in goods and services.

Also, within the KJCS program, from the category of municipal expenditures have been transferred €9,000.00 to the category of goods and services.

With the requirements of the KJC and the Kosovo Government decision, there was an additional budget fund of € 312,001.00 allocated to good and services category, while to the category of subsidies and transfers was allocated the amount of € 119,028.00.

Also, with the same decision of the Government of Kosovo, on behalf of budget savings, the budget of KJC in the category of goods and services is reduced for €147,190.74.

Other reductions in the budget are made at the end of December / 2016 by the Ministry of Finance without any prior consultation.



Final Budget KJC for 2016 after the aforementioned cuts and revenues and donations carried forward from 2015 is € 20,234,241.42.

### **PARTICIPATION OF KJC BUDGET IN KOSOVO'S BUDGET**

The court revenues generated by the Council respectively the courts, Secretariat and the Special Chamber for the period January-December 2016 include the amount of 8,051,611.34 €. Execution revenues plan is 89.61 % in comparison with the plan of 2016 (8,985.000.00).

When comparing the table no. 1 and no. 2, the KJC budget for 2016 is higher compared to 2015 in the amount of 1,111,996.22 (mainly in the category of wages and salaries and goods and services).

Budget execution expressed in percentage is lower in 2016 (96.51%) in comparison with 2015 (98.28%).

Expenses for services comprise training, representation services (lawyer, expert, lay-judge), contracting services, printing services (printed material for courts).

Telecommunication expenses comprise cell phone expenses, internet expenses and postage ones.

Fuel expenses include: fuel for heating and for vehicle.

Other purchases include: supply with office supplies, supply with drink water, supply with hygienic material and uniforms for security guards and judges.

Maintenance and repairs include vehicle maintenance, court buildings maintenance, maintenance of IT equipment and generators as well as of air conditioners, cameras, detectors etc.

Travel expenses include: travel expenses inside the country (Transfer of court staff in Mitrovica) and travel expenses abroad (advance for traveling abroad, per-diems for travels abroad).

Purchase of furniture and equipment include supply with inventory for the courts and various equipment for courts and KJCS.

The rent for buildings includes rents for court facilities ( BC facility in Peja, Graçanica, Novo Brdo, the Basic Court in Gjakova, Basic Court in in Mitrovica).

Representation expenses include representation expenses for the KJCS and courts.

Court decisions include expenses arising from court decisions.

Vehicle insurance and registration include: insurance and registration of vehicles.

Marketing and advertisement include: announcements in daily newspapers.

## CAPITAL INVESTMENTS

It is worth mentioning that during 2015 the KJC has executed some projects from the capital investments category, mainly for the construction and refurbishment of court premises. The construction of Basic Court building in Ferizaj was completed and emergency refurbishments in some courts were performed as well.

## PUBLIC COMMUNICATION

During 2016, the Public Information Office of the KJCS, based on the principle of better informing, had many activities that resulted in transparency and mutual cooperation, both between the written and visual media as well as non-governmental organizations (NGOs).

Besides repeated requests to print and visual media, Public Information Office of the KJCS, responded correctly to all NGOs that work and operate in Kosovo, that monitored the work of the judiciary, in particular, the work of the courts.

Public Information Office of the KJCS has also supported the Non-governmental Organization (NGO) "Life" in Deçan, which with the support of the United States of America (USA) Embassy has organized meetings with pupils of secondary schools with the topic *"Recognition and respect of property and inheritance rights of women"*.

Also, this office has supported non-governmental organization 'ATR', which during the reporting year, organized ten (10) workshops on educating the public.

Said workshops were held in ten (10) municipalities across Kosovo. These workshops were held in Gjiilan, Gjakova, Rahovec, Vushtrri, Pristina, Mitrovica and Prizren.

The main goal of these workshops was to increase the knowledge about the functioning of the justice system, to encourage discussion on key issues that affect the public's confidence in the justice system and to develop suitable solutions and approaches to furthering public confidence in the justice system.

Also, during 2016 has continued its cooperation with the USAID project, JJSP with various training workshops in the field of public information, as well as all other local and international organizations dealing with the Judicial System in Kosovo.

## COURT PERFORMANCE REVIEW UNIT

According to Guidelines of the Council and its Committee for the Administration of the Courts, the Court Performance Review Unit (CPRU) evaluates the work of courts and proposes to the Council policies or directions for reforming or improving the work of the courts.

The CPRU in 2016 submitted to the KJC for review and approval, three (3) final performance reports reviewed during 2015, such as follows:

- Report 2015/01 - 'Review of the process of movement of court cases from one court to another ';
- Report 2015/02 - 'Review of the distribution process of cases randomly to judges';
- Report 2015/03 - 'Review in the Court of Appeals for criminal cases confirmed, amended and annulled presented in comparative digital mirror ';

Two (2) drafted reports during 2016 were submitted to the KJC for review and approval in 2017, as follows:

- "Review of safety of judges and support staff in the courts';
- "Review of the process of issuing certificates to citizens, whether they are or are not under investigation';

Also, the CPRU has prepared its initial documentation to perform judicial performance with the topic:

- "Review of court cases (criminal and civil) as how many of them were returned for retrial to the first instance court, for one (1) or more times and duration of the trials since the initial moment 'in implementing KJC Strategy 2014-2019.

## COURTS STATISTICS REPORT FOR 2016

The Statistical report on the work of the courts for 2016 reflects the work of the courts separately for each court branch and for each level of the court.

The report includes the Supreme Court, Special Chamber of Supreme Court, the Court of Appeal, 7 Basic Courts, but this report is lacking the data for Basic court in Mitrovicë –branch in Leposaviq and Zubin Potok because of its non-functioning.

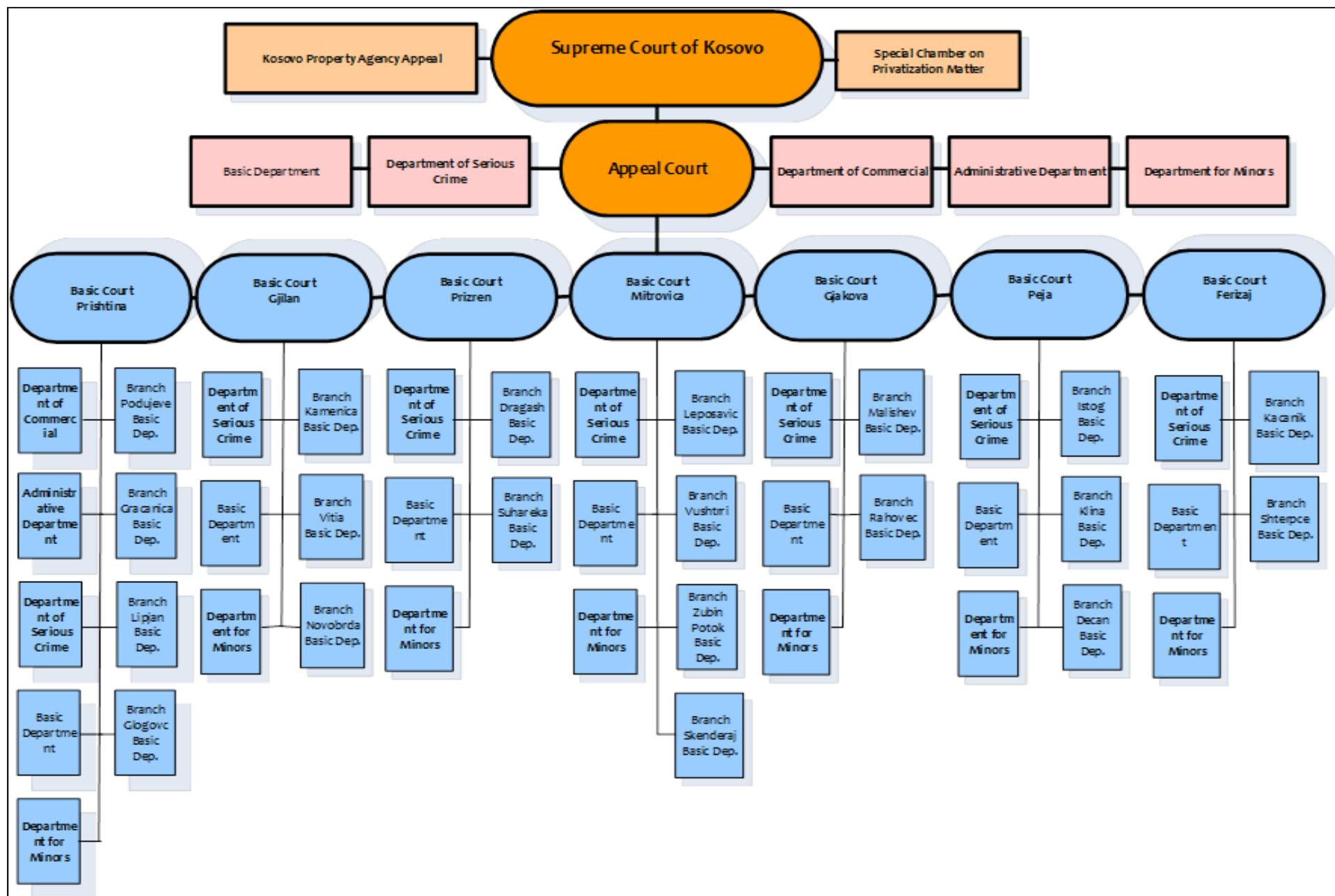
The statistical report provides greater details on the number of cases by its type, as well as in it is presented a brief analysis of the workload of judges with serious and light cases, details on the judge's efficiency in resolving the most serious and light cases as well the average level of Kosovo, as by the workload with serious and light cases, including the efficiency of the judges in resolving the serious and light cases.

The analysis for the minor offences is separated by the number of cases and number of judges.

*Serious cases are considered:* Pre-trial proceedings, I instance criminal cases (Serious Crime Department and General Department), II instance Criminal cases of juveniles in preparatory proceedings, Criminal cases of juveniles in the proceedings before the college, I instance Civil cases, II instance Civil cases, administrative cases, II instance administrative cases, Commercial disputes, II instance Commercial disputes, in heritage and non-contentious cases.

*Light cases are considered:* Complaints against the rules on imposing the detention, Civil cases execution, commercial and different criminal disputes execution in the Court of appeal, while other cases dealing (certificates, contracts, signatures and manuscripts verification, etc.) are not included in the workload and efficiency of judges.

From the National Backlog Reduction Strategy comes out that Statistics department not to highlight in the report as cases, thus the cases dealing with budget, such as: lump sum and court expenses.
